This document explains and demonstrates how to prepare your camera-ready abstracts. The best is to read these instructions and follow the outline of this text. Use Times New Roman, 11pt, as text font. The text area for your manuscript must be 160 mm wide and 240 mm high, with 25 mm (1 in) top and left margins. Do not place any text or page numbering outside this area. Use a page size of approximately A4 (210 mm × 297 mm). Abstracts cannot exceed 1 page.

All manuscripts must be in English. Submission are accepted in RTF (MS WORD), L^AT_EX, or PDF format, provided the instructions given here are followed. Sample RTF (MS WORD) and L^AT_EX files are provided on the conference web site <http://www.smmo.org>. Please make sure to save your file as "Rich Text Format" when using Microsoft Word or OpenOffice.

Tables. Tables (refer with: Table 1, Table 2, . . .) should be presented as part of the text.

Figures. Figures (refer with: Fig. 1, Fig. 2, . . .) also should be presented as part of the text, leaving enough space so that the caption will not be confused with the text. The caption should be self-contained and placed *below or beside* the figure (Times New Roman, 10 pt or \small in L^AT_EX). Figures in L^AT_EX submissions should be provided as separate .eps or .pdf files that are included using the graphicx package.

Equations. Equations (refer with: (1), (2), . . .) should be indented 7.5 mm. There should be 3 pt of space above the equation and 3 pt of space below it before the text continues. The equations have to be numbered sequentially, and the number put in parentheses at the right-hand edge of the text. Punctuation appears after the equation but before the equation number, e.g.

$$c^2 = a^2 + b^2. \tag{1}$$

References are cited in the text just by square brackets [1]. Two or more references at a time may be put in one set of brackets [2, 3]. The references are to be numbered in the order in which they are cited in the text and are to be listed at the end of the abstract, see our example below. Please use Times New Roman, 10 pt. See you in Warsaw!!
